Cluny western Lighthouse

Reach for the sky by climbing up the Cheese Tower so that you might admire Cluny in the best possible way. Its out-of-the-ordinary abbey, the biggest church in Christendom before St Peter's basilica in Rome was erected, its medieval houses, its equestrian center...are all elements that will take you on a journey through time and that will help you understand why Cluny and the Cluniac Sites are candidates to UNESCO's World Heritage List!

Solutré rock

Immerse yourself into the heart of an exceptional site: Solutré Pouilly Vergisson Great Site of France.

Solutré Rock and its little sister called Vergisson Rock arise as the sentries of a magnificent landscape in the heart of a site which has been awarded the Great Site of France quality label and which as been classified as Natura 2000. These

mineral Light

treasures constitute a culminating point of pride of a visit in the Mâconnais area.

Two limestone cliffs, which appeared as a result of a rare geological phenomenon, with a «sea of grapevines» spreading out at their feet, according to native Alphonse de Lamartine's poetic description.

Tournus Spiritual Light

You must stroll around in Tournus, a little quaint and charming town offering many assets! It spreads out along the Saône river and has Mediterranean accents architecturally speaking: narrow streets and old houses with colourful facades and curved roof tiles. Saint-Philibert Abbey is worth a visit: its beautiful cloister, its mystical crypt, but also its monastic buildings... In the city centre, the 17th and 18th -century former hospital is an absolute must-see.

Stories of fine stones

Stones are everywhere in South Burgundy!

Whether it is for the erection of big abbeys, the building of nice medieval houses, of sober and elegant Romanesque churches, but also for the construction of «cadoles» (little drystone huts which were used as a shelter by our brave wine-growers) or solid «murgers» (thick walls made of stones) to fence meadows, you will discover them alongside our roads. Sometimes purely ornamental, sometimes for farming purposes, sometimes carrying spirituality, they have shaped and still shape up our landscapes. Closely related to men, stones tell their own story...

Take the time to admire them, as they reflect South Burgundy's light and spirit!

Whether it is in Blanot's churches where the bell tower is in perfect harmony with the adjoining priory or even the church of Martailly-les-Brancion which dominates the Grosne valley and faces a remarkable panorama,

Burgundian Romanesque Art is here sublimated at its best. A certain solemnity and an inspiring sobriety stick out of these numerous places which are so special and so captivating.

Many other churches await you and will take you to an amazing journey: Ozenay Church, but also the churches of Trivy, Chapaize, Saint-Vincent-des-Prés, Le Villars...just to name a few.

Living in a castle...

Driving through the roads of The Lamartinien Valley, at the heart of the Cluny-Mâcon area, you will not want to miss the opportunity to admire the massive and impressive **Berzé-le-Châtel fortress**. No doubt that this fortified castle, closely linked to Cluny, will seduce you with its fourteen towers and its entrance gates, its Carolingian chapel and its gardens.

To combine the pleasure for your palate and historical discoveries, we advise you to go and visit **Pierreclos Castle**. Tour its refined gardens peacefully, its dungeon, its weapons room, its kitchen, its punishment cells...


Take the time to taste the wines that are produced at the castle. You will even be able to stay a little longer if you choose to spend a night accommodated in a guest house with the luxurious Earls' suite.

Further up north towards Tournus, another medieval castle will appeal to you: the very influential **Brancion Castle**. Building on their strategic position as strongholds harnessed between the Saône river, Tournus and Cluny, the lords of Brancion, very powerful in the region at the time, were often in conflict with the monks of Cluny. The castle, the village, its covered markets, the church, are worth visiting. Not mentioning the breathtaking panorama overhanging the valley.

Alphonse de Lamartine Saint-Point Castle

Alphonse de Lamartine, who was born in Mâcon in 1790, is an emblematic figurehead of South Burgundy. Our territory is, indeed, strongly influenced by the footprint left by this man. His last dwelling was the **family castle of Saint-Point**, and it maintains unchanged the numerous historical testimonies of the illustrious character that he was in the 19th century. Known primarily for his literary accomplishments, it must be added that Lamartine was also a distinguished politician from 1812 to his death in 1869. From a strictly literary point of view, Lamartine's works were marked by the romantic lyricism. He was also the definite eulogist of love, nature and death. Mâcon's Museum of the Ursulines has recently opened a complete exhibition wing dedicated to the poet, his life, and his works.



Sunken treasures...

Underground cavities and prehistoric sites galore, South Burgundy invites you to go back in time!

Head off to adventure and explore the bowels of the earth at **the Blanot Caves**: a stunning walkabout at least 100 metres deep down in a place which has managed to keep its natural character. **The Caves of Azé** are also a site where you will be able to marvel at the hidden treasures that lie underneath our feet, but also admire the testimony and evidence given by one of the oldest human settlements known in Saône-et-Loire.

And finally, as you discover Prehistory in South Burgundy you will definitely be tempted to take a peek inside **Solutré** which is an absolute must-see. Key spot of the Palaeolithic era (Old Stone Age), this is one of the richest archaeological sites throughout Europe. You will have to push the doors of the museum situated at the very foot of Solutré Rock to find out more about the precious collections representing this past era.



Visit a unique site

The Vignerons de Mancey invite you to explore their unique premises dedicated to vines and wines in south Burgundy

Vine and wine have always played a major role in Burgundy's tourism contributing to the international reputation of the region.

Lately, « wine tourism » has made its appearance in the common language.

Up to recently, the tourist visiting the North of Mâcon had very few opportunities in wine tourism in this part of Burgundy. This gap has now been filled : Les Vignerons de Mancey have opened a new tasting and sales area with an educational and discovery tour dedicated to vine and wine.



THE DISCOVERY TOUR

This innovating site in the region, was designed to make you discover Burgundy. From the vine to the glass, we will give you all the keys to understand Burgundy's Wines, in a fun and accessible way to everyone.

It is a place of initiation, learning, and exchanges as well as a welcoming and convivial space

You will discover, during a fun and cultural tour, the treasures of Burgundy wines : geology, grape varieties, vegetative cycle of the vineyard, know-how of the winemaker, terroirs, appellations, the making of Crémant de Bourgogne as well as the food and wine pairing and vintages keeping potential.

THE TASTING

As you wander through the tasting area, you will experience the sensory evaluation process and how to create a memory bank of these wonderful tastes and aromas.

By Vignerons de Mancey's shop, you will find wines from the Mâcon area – part of them vinified by the Vignerons de Mancey – You will also find wines from other areas of Burgundy as we also display wines from 20 domains. Altogether, 85 appellations are represented !




Hiking through the vineyards in Burgundy

Come and hike in **South Burgundy Massif**, a rugged hilly territory providing very nice circuits between Tournus, Fleurville, Sennecey-le-Grand and Cluny. 750 km of marked trails, starting from the banks of the Saône river to the lake of Laives all the way through the villages of La Salle and Cluny. Ranging from easy to very easy, walking paths for all! Eight hiking routes from 2.9 km to 12.4 km are also open to discover the Great Solutré Site of Pouilly Vergisson. Whether it is a short sunday walk or an uphill hike reserved for more hardened enthusiasts!

Walking is also a way of opening oneself to travelling! Our beautiful territory is crossed by numerous great itineraries! From the north to the south, three Major National Hiking Trails are available to you. The GR765 has an enhanced specificity: this is the Pilgrim's **Way to Saint-James-of-Compostela** from Cluny to Le-Puy-en-Velay. Follow the GR's white and red markings and the gold scallop on a blue background. Stopover B&B lodges, reception points for pilgrims and service companies can also easily be found to accommodate you all the way.

Setting off on a journey around the paths and tracks also goes hand in hand with exchanging: with your family, friends or even with other walkers that you had never met before and that you will learn to know... Among the big must-go events, the «walk of the Monks» takes place in september and you will have the opportunity to follow a portion of the Monks' Trail, a famous path which links the church of Saint-Martin-de-Laives, near Sennecey-le-Grand, to Cenves, in the Rhône department, walking through Cluny exactly where it joins the Pilgrim's Way to Saint-James-of-Compostela.



Let's go hiking!

South Burgundy can boast an impressive 1000 km network of entirely marked and completely maintained trails, which is ideal for walkers, experienced or not, with various levels of difficulty.

Freewheel cycling!

Here, «**slow tourism**» is sovereign; take the time to find out more about this authentic and inspiring region at a snail's pace... (from Burgundy, of course!)

The Great Loop of South Burgundy

Green Path and **Blue Path** criss-cross South Burgundy and have thus shaped a 145-km loop enabling to discover the territory's wealth. Ideally conceived for a virtuous stay, with a gentle roaming approach, the Great Loop of South Burgundy is accessible to all. Here, sunday riders or skilled sportsmen will find what they enjoy through a broad spectrum of circuits. Many families use these safe paths which were once hauling ways or rail lines but which have been transformed and rehabilitated for the greatest delights of young and old!

The Massif of South Burgundy is an invitation for mountain bikers to discover valleys, hillsides and hedged farmlands along with the seasons. Answer the autumn's call in South Burgundy and treat yourself to an exciting ride in our immediate surroundings which are countries where the golden light and the shimmering colours of the vineyards sketch breathtaking landscapes!

Here, the water has shaped up the landscapes with the **Saône and Seille** which are rivers offering possibilities for a myriad of activities!

The **Lake of Saint-Point**, situated at the heart of the Lamartinian Valley, is ideal for a day of relaxation and swimming with the family.

Lakes and rivers are an incentive to contemplate some towns and villages which flourish on their banks and which reflect off the surface of the water.

Whether you prefer idleness and sunbathing, in the relaxation mode on a boat, or whether you are motivated to paddle, South Burgundy will fulfill your wishes.

Although Lamartine was inspired by another lake in his famous poem, you cannot help but think of it while loitering along the banks of the one which stretches at the foot of his Saint-Point castle. The lake of Saint-Point offers its fresh waters to the summer vacationers who came here to make the most of its nautical leisure activities. It is also a fishing ground, a hiking place and a picnic spot thanks to its equipped and landscaped areas.

Gathering with the family!

South Burgundy is a coveted destination for the families!

At the heart of an unspoilt undulating countryside, in between Green Path, Blue Path, vineyard and hiking trails, opt for a tribe holiday off the beaten tracks!

As valiant knights, set off to conquer our fortified **castles in Berzé-le-Châtel and Brancion!**

Be ready to play the archaeologist's apprentice, and admire the collections of our **prehistoric sites of Azé and Solutré** and – throughout South Burgundy – the testimonies of a rich past.

Buddy historians have not been left out. Many visits and games adapted to families enable not only to discover the Cluniac Sites and the collections of our museums but also the architectural secrets of our towns and villages.

Dreaming of activities in open air or looking forward to **100% nature adventures?**

Explore our forest leisure parks, ride our lands on horseback or with a donkey, or even admire the geological marvels of our subterranean cavities. But we must not forget our flagship sites aimed at families: the **Touroparc** zoological and leisure park, the **Duboeuf Hamlet** – which is the largest European oenopark – and its Beaujolais garden, and also the **Stud Farm of Cluny** with its stunning equestrian shows.

As for young scientists, they will have the opportunity to continue the journey in **Lab71** in order to gather experiences, both recreational and educational.



Enlightened epicureans

One land, numerous wines...

Vineyards have shaped up South Burgundy's landscapes for two thousand years alongside the banks of the Saône river all the way down from Tournus to **North Beaujolais**. Two wineries mix with each other: **the Mâconnais** - the most southern soil in Burgundy - which is the cradle of the Chardonnay grapes - and the Beaujolais with its famous wines - located in the far south of the region - which is the kingdom of the black Gamay variety.

You are wine lovers? Then choose to stay in South Burgundy for an oenotouristic holiday! On foot, on horseback, by scooter, riding an electric bike... There are many ways to discover the vineyards, their appellations and their wines.

Go through the terroir of the notorious **Pouilly-Fuissé**, a wine which became a first growth/vintage «Premier Cru» in 2020! Roam the vineyard tracks of **Chardonnay**, the village that gave its name to the famous grape variety...

Taste, on their lands, the wines of Chénas, Juliénas, Moulin-à-Vent and Saint-Amour. Well-known names which certainly ring a bell in the ears of distinguished wine specialists. These enthusiasts will also be delighted to revise the history of the Chasselas grapes in the eponymous village and to discuss their origins.



NEW IN 2023 / The City of Climates and wines of Burgundy in Mâcon!

The City of Climates and wines of Burgundy is a cultural site dedicated to the regional wine-growing heritage and available in three places: Chablis, Beaune and Mâcon. In Mâcon, the City of Climates and wines of Burgundy gives pride and precedence to Mâconnais and Côte Chalonnaise wines. The curved shapes of the building surmounted by a totem with the aspect of a wooden wine press catch immediately the eyes' attention. Inside, the immersive scenography will plunge the visitor into the very heart of the vineyard landscapes and will provide a sensory course rich in experiences.


Recipe idea: cheese pastry puffs

For 4 to 6 persons:

Ingredients:

- . 25 cl of whole milk
- . 100 g of butter
- . 1 level teaspoon of salt
- . 150 g of flour
- . 4 eggs
- . 125 g of Emmental or Comté cheese
- . 1 tablespoon of water

- . Pour the milk into a pan, add some butter and milk and boil till the butter has melted.
- . Off the heat, add the flour, mix well and then put it all back on the stove at low heat so that the mixture dries out.
- . Remove from the heat, leave to cool a little and stir in the 4 eggs one by one while mixing very vigorously.
- . Cut the cheese in little cubes and mix it with the dough.
- . Pre-heat the oven at a temperature of 200°C.
- . With the help of a tablespoon, drop off some small balls of dough on baking paper (not too tight because they will swell!).
- . Place in the oven for 25 minutes.
- . Right out of the oven, let cool during 10 min before you can treat yourself!

Morning

Put on your hiking shoes and head off towards the Bears' Path in Azé! It crosses a wild nature at the heart of a magnificent park, where lions and cave bears used to shelter during Prehistory. In those preserved places, you must also notice the numerous fauna and flora species that are present nowadays. You may have the chance to meet the black kite, the alpine newt and who knows, the Apollo butterfly! This is an easy walk that stretches over 1 km only.

Visiting the caves of Azé

After that family hike, go on and visit the archaeological museum and the caves of Azé.

Afternoon

The «Autour de la Terre» pottery workshop

Jean-Luc Feltrini has transformed this earth for up to 30 years, and each manufacturing step reveals itself as a discovery. Turning and modeling, but also the creation of enamels that are timelessly renewed, glazed decors (enamelling by the use of a squeezer or paintbrush), the mysteries of cooking...
